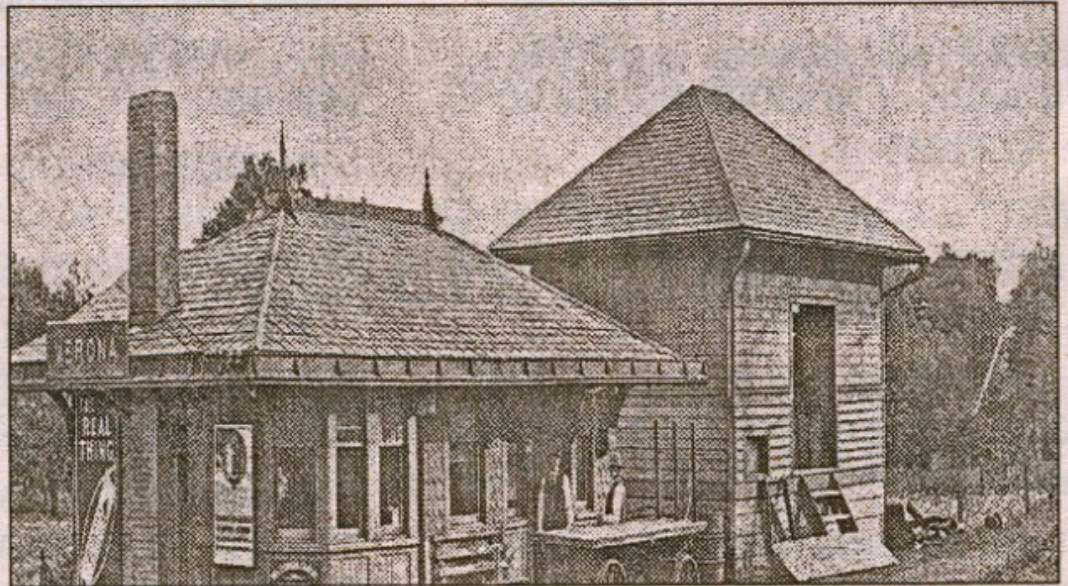

For train buffs, history enthusiasts and anyone interested in learning about Verona and Cedar Grove's beginnings, attending a program at 7:30 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 23, at the Cedar Grove Library would be time well spent.

well: Part I" at its general meeting. Historian Phil Jaeger will give a PowerPoint program that examines the remains of the Caldwell Railroad, and its successor Caldwell Railway which was routed through Cedar Grove and Verona. The line, which later became the Caldwell Branch of the Erie Railroad, will be examined in detail through 1979 when the rails were removed. Part II of the program will be presented at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 28, in the Cedar Grove Public Library, which is located in the municipal complex at 525 Pompton Ave.
